Title **Additional Toilet facilities at Auburn Terminal Yard.**

Reason: When the Auburn Terminal Yard was constructed an outside toilet was provided. This was of the range closet type with four seats. It never fully served its purpose, for unsanitary reasons and was totally inadequate for the number of men employed.

During the war a great number of women were employed. Under AFE 3094-17 a frame building, provided with 2 toilets, 2 drinking fountains and 2 sinks, was constructed for their use. Upon the conclusion of the period of the general employment of women the necessity for this toilet did not exist, the three remaining women stenographers using the toilet in the storeroom.

The unsanitary conditions were a source of discussion and preparations were under way towards alleviating conditions. The shopmen's strike came on during the summer necessitating emergency preparations for the proper protection & housing of men. Sanitary provisions were necessary for the large number of men staying in the yard.

The unsanitary range closet was removed and a sanitary standard set of 8 bowls were substituted. Three shower baths were provided in the old women's toilet as well as an 8 bowl battery wash basin set, (over)
